Female student reports Rape by a known suspect.

### Supplemental Narrative By Regina Shoopman, 02/14/20 16:17

On February 14, 2020 at approximately 1440 hours, I responded to the OSU Wexner Medical Center for a sexual assault report.

Upon arrival I met with [REDACTED] in Emergency [REDACTED]. There was an advocate with her. I asked [REDACTED] what happened and she briefly explained that she and her friend, [REDACTED] [REDACTED], had gone out to a fraternity/sorority "pregame" at a fraternity house on 2/13/20. Around 2330 hours, and after having some drinks, they walked to the [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED] purchased a mixed drink that she and [REDACTED] shared. [REDACTED] met a male, [REDACTED]. Around midnight the three of them got on the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] says she vaguely remembers the bus ride and arriving at [REDACTED] but does not remember anything after that until the following morning at 0900 hours. [REDACTED] woke up alone in her dorm [REDACTED] Park-Stradley. She had no clothes on, felt like she had vaginal intercourse, and found a condom wrapper on the floor along with a gray t-shirt. [REDACTED] did not know who she had been with. [REDACTED] said she thinks her drink at the [REDACTED] bar may have been drugged. A short time later that morning (2/14) she received a snapchat from the male she believes she was with.

[REDACTED] did not want to identify the male who she believes she had intercourse. [REDACTED] said she wasn't sure if she wanted to pursue any action against the male, but wanted evidence collected in case she decided to.

After getting [REDACTED] to me what happened, I covered her recollection of what happened in more detail. After finishing [REDACTED] interview I spoke to [REDACTED] who was also being treated at the OSU Wexner Medical Center. [REDACTED] stated she had woken up on 2/14 with no pants on at [REDACTED]. She stated she did not remember anything after arriving at [REDACTED] either.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went to the "pregame" at an unidentified fraternity house. They arrived around 2130 hours. [REDACTED] said she only had four or five cans of beer that she had opened. [REDACTED] said she had some beer and a soft mixed drink, "twisted tea" that was being served at the fraternity. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] did not share that drink with her. They left the fraternity area after 2300 hours, and walked to the [REDACTED] said that she walked to the "short side" of the bar and ordered a vodka and soda with a splash of cranberry. She paid with cash and does not know if the bartender was a male or female. [REDACTED] says she and [REDACTED] shared that drink. [REDACTED] said she never put the drink down or left it. She said they were standing by a railing and had the drink in her hand, resting it on the railing. It was in her peripheral vision, but she was not directly watching it. [REDACTED] said she met [REDACTED] at the [REDACTED]. She did not know [REDACTED] before this date. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] bought a bottle of champagne the two shared. [REDACTED] did not share in the champagne. [REDACTED] says her

recollections become hazy as they were leaving the [REDACTED] said the same thing. Around midnight, [REDACTED] took the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said she vaguely remembers being on the bus with [REDACTED]. She does not remember herself being with a male. [REDACTED] said she remembers being at [REDACTED] and not wanting to give the bartender her credit card. [REDACTED] said she thinks she had another drink at [REDACTED]" but does not remember paying for one and there was no activity on her credit card. [REDACTED] said she doesn't remember anything else until she woke up the following morning.

[REDACTED] said she woke up around 0900 hours in her bed with no clothes on. She was alone. Her body felt as though she had vaginal intercourse, but she could not remember doing so. She went down the hall to the restroom and ran into her room mate, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told her, "That guy you were with was cute." [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] she didn't know who he was. After returning to her dorm room, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] talked. [REDACTED] told her that when she [REDACTED] returned to the dorm room she found [REDACTED] in the room with the male and she left. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] stayed down the hall overnight. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] feels bad about leaving her room mate in the dorm room with the male. [REDACTED] did not want me to talk to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said she located a gray t-shirt in her room that she believed belonged to the male she was with. She also found an open condom wrapper. I asked if [REDACTED] had checked around her dorm room for the actual condom, and she said she did not. She declined me going to her dorm room to look for it or any other evidence. [REDACTED] said she had already washed her bed sheets and clothing that morning. [REDACTED] agreed to call the police division if she found the condom or any other evidence when she got back to her dorm. [REDACTED] said she talked to [REDACTED] later in the morning, and both agreed they thought they had been drugged at the [REDACTED], since [REDACTED] did not drink anything but canned beer at the fraternity.

[REDACTED] said she thinks she knows who the male she was with because in the morning she received a snapchat from a male she did not know. She asked him if he was the one she was with, and he said yes. [REDACTED] said she asked him what happened and he replied, "We were making out and had sex." [REDACTED] said she did not respond after that. She says she is pretty sure she knows who he is based on his snapchat, but she did not want to identify him to me. She said she had never met him before this event.

[REDACTED] said she does not remember anything after taking the bus to [REDACTED]. She woke up at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] says she was still snapchatting with [REDACTED]. She does not think [REDACTED] had anything to do with the possible drugging. She does believe that she and [REDACTED] had sexual intercourse that she did not want. [REDACTED] had reported the incident to Columbus Police. [REDACTED] stated she would send the CPD report number.

[REDACTED] said she had contacted her parents. They were able to provide her with a track of her phone for the night. It showed that she left [REDACTED] around 0113 hours and arrived at Park-Stradey around 0130 hours. [REDACTED] provided me with a description of what she was wearing, a white V-neck crop sweater and black zip-up cropped jacket that is orange on the inside. She had on black jeans and was wearing her hair down. Her hair is below the shoulder in length.

I have requested CAC review Park-Stradey video and attempt to locate [REDACTED] coming onto the building to see who she is with. Video(camera [REDACTED]) was located and requested.

The video shows at 0118 hours, four people get out of a dark sedan, believed to be an UBER or LYFT. A female gets out of the front passenger side and walks away, she is probably not involved. [REDACTED] and the suspect get out of the driver's side rear. They both walk to the door. [REDACTED] has her phone in her hand. A male gets out of the passenger side rear, holds the door for [REDACTED] and the suspect. This male swipes his ID to get into the building. Unknown if this male is involved in the incident or just shared the ride.

Elevator camera [REDACTED] shows the three get onto the elevator. They all go to the [REDACTED] floor and get off. About two minutes later, the male that swiped his ID to enter the building gets back on an elevator, believed to be camera [REDACTED] and goes to the [REDACTED] floor.

At approximately 0141 hours, the suspect gets on the elevator (camera [REDACTED]) and goes to the [REDACTED] floor. About two minutes later he gets back on the elevator (camera [REDACTED]) and goes back to the [REDACTED] floor. At 0237 hours, the suspect gets on the elevator (camera [REDACTED]) and goes up to the [REDACTED] floor. That is the last time he is seen on camera. A camera footage was requested. (RITM1382322,RITM1382267)

I spoke briefly with the SANE nurse getting ready to do [REDACTED] exam. She stated [REDACTED] did give urine and blood samples for drug testing. [REDACTED] said that she did not request drug testing. I collected the gray t-shirt and open condom wrapper that [REDACTED] had brought to the hospital. They were loose in her bag when I collected them. I submitted them into property.

Later Officer Catron responded to the OSU Wexner Medical Center and collected the SANE examination kit and logged it into property.

I provided a resource packet to [REDACTED] and confirmed that [REDACTED] received resources from Columbus Police.

To the members of the Theta Delta chapter of Beta Theta Pi,

Student Conduct has received information that describes conduct by Beta Theta Pi on February 13, 2020. The report details concerns related to alcohol management and/or alcohol distribution to underage individuals. I am investigating whether this conduct may have occurred and violated the following sections of the university's Code of Student Conduct:

- 3335-23-04 (I) Alcohol. Use, underage intoxication, production, distribution, sale, or possession of alcohol in a manner prohibited under law or applicable university policy or facility policy.
- 3335-23-04 (B1) Endangering behavior. Taking or threatening action that endangers the safety, physical or mental health, or life of any person, or creates a reasonable fear of such action.

Based on the nature of the allegation, I am directing your chapter not to have any events where alcohol is present pending the outcome of this investigation.

**As a leader of the organization you are required to notify the entire membership of this matter. Please send one email with this letter as an attachment to all members of your organization and copy me on the email.**

Should any individuals wish to provide information to me regarding this investigation they are encouraged to email me at Reistad.1@osu.edu.

All members of the organization are advised that should they violate the directives listed in this letter that they will be charged as an individual student with the following policy:

3335-23-04(G) Failure to Comply with University or Civil Authority – Failure to comply with legitimate directives of authorized university officials, law enforcement or emergency personnel, identified as such, in the performance of their duties, including failure to identify oneself when so requested; or violation of the terms of a disciplinary sanction

As a leader of the organization, you must contact Student Conduct **as soon as possible**, and no later than February 24, 2020, to schedule a preliminary conference with me. The purpose of this conference is twofold. First, I will explain and answer your questions about the Student Conduct process. Second, you will have the opportunity to explain what happened, to provide materials, and to identify other individuals with information about the alleged incident. Please submit any relevant materials (including your own written statement, text messages, photos, emails, etc.) by email to me at [reistad.1@osu.edu](mailto:reistad.1@osu.edu) prior to our meeting.

**You must bring the following information with you to the meeting, or you may submit it prior:**

Guest list for the registered event;

Copy of registered event form;

Name(s) of anyone who served alcohol at the event/pregame (i.e., bartender);

Name(s) of those who live at the property where the event/pre-game occurred;

Any other documents you'd like to provide that demonstrates risk management practices were followed

You may bring one advisor and a registered co-leader (if applicable) to your preliminary conference. Your advisor can be any person who is not involved as a witness or other participant in the case. Upon request, Student Life's Student Advocacy Center (<http://advocacy.osu.edu>) is able to provide information and assistance in this process.

You will find the Code of Student Conduct and information about our process at <http://studentconduct.osu.edu>. Additionally, I have attached a Statement of Student Rights and a description of the university's Hearing Procedures to this letter.

Students are responsible for requesting accommodations when they feel they are needed. Should you need an accommodation based on the impact of a disability during the Student Conduct process, please contact the university's ADA Coordinator's office at (614) 292-6207 (voice), (614) 688-8605 (TTY), [ada-osu@osu.edu](mailto:ada-osu@osu.edu), or visit <https://ada.osu.edu/>. This hold could prevent you from scheduling classes; viewing grades; or receiving transcripts, diplomas or refunds. Please note that if you do not participate in our process, I may continue this investigation without your input. This could result in charges, a hearing, and sanctions if a violation is found.

## Student Rights and Responsibilities

The Code of Student Conduct provides the procedures and definitions used to respond to complaints regarding students' behavior. Many of the rights and responsibilities found in the Code of Student Conduct are highlighted below. For a full review of all the rights and responsibilities given to students please refer to the Code of Student Conduct, which can be found at [www.studentconduct.osu.edu](http://www.studentconduct.osu.edu).

- Students shall receive written notice of university charges, through one of multiple methods of communication, including: in person; in a residence hall mailbox; by email to official university email address, which may then direct the student to view the notice in a secure website; by text message or other electronic communication; or by mail to a local or permanent address. **(3335-23-08-A)**
  
- Students are afforded the opportunity to meet with a university official following the notification of charges. **(3335-23-08-C)**
  - o University staff members authorized to investigate complaints usually request a meeting with students prior to issuing charges.
  - o Once charges are issued, students can request another meeting.
  - o Students are strongly encouraged to meet with a university official.
  
- Students may choose to bring an advisor (i.e., support person) for support throughout the disciplinary process. **(3335-23-12-C)**
  - o The advisor may be any person other than a witness.
  - o The advisor may only counsel the student and may not actively participate in the process.
  
- Students are offered options for the resolution of charges. **(3335-23-08-D)**
  - o Generally, students may choose between an administrative hearing or a hearing before the University Conduct Board to resolve charges other than those related to:
    - Academic Misconduct **(3335-23-04-A)**
    - Discrimination and harassment, including, but not limited to sexual misconduct, based on a protected class, prohibited by university policies 1.15 and 1.10, which can be found at <http://policies.osu.edu>. **(3335-23-02-C)**
  - o NOTE: If students fail to respond to the initiation of charges and there is enough information to support finding a violation, the hearing officer may issue an administrative decision, as long as the sanctions do not include suspension or dismissal. **(3335-23-09)**
  
- An administrative decision allows the student to admit, in writing, to the violation(s), and serves as a request to have appropriate sanctions made by the hearing officer, rather than having charges referred to a hearing body. **(3335-23-09)**

- In these cases, the student waives rights to a hearing and any procedural guarantees that come from taking part in a hearing.
- Students have the opportunity to request a separate hearing and choose either an administrative (with one university official) or board hearing, except under special circumstances. **(3335-23-10-C)**
  - Students will receive notice of the hearing at least 10 calendars prior to the hearing, including all charge(s), logistical information, and statement of student's rights. **(3335-23-11-C)**
    - The respondent may request to postpone the hearing for a reasonable cause, which must be made in writing and received by the person sending the hearing notification at least 2 business days in advance. Decisions on postponements are made at the discretion of the university. **(3335-23-11-D)**
  - Attendance at hearings, though not mandated is strongly encouraged, and also limited to, respondents and those directly involved or requested by the hearing body.
  - Students will be informed of witnesses invited to attend the hearing by the university, and will be able to invite relevant factual witnesses to attend. **(3335-23-12-D)**
    - The respondent will have the opportunity to ask questions of all witnesses.
  - A single record of the proceedings, consisting of written notes, audio recording, or another method determined by the hearing body will be made. This will remain the property of the university but will be made available to the respondent for review during the appeal period. **(3335-23-14)**
  - Students will only be found in violation if a preponderance of evidence supports the charges. **(3335-23-12-E)**
- Students found in violation of the code, or who accept responsibility for violating the code, will receive sanctions that should be commensurate with the violations found to have occurred. **(3335-23-17)**
  - A disciplinary sanction: a formal reprimand; disciplinary probation; suspension; or dismissal, will be given in addition to (in most cases) educational outcomes.
- Students found to have violated the code of student conduct have the right to appeal the original decision. **(3335-23-18)**
  - All appeals must be sent within five working days after the date on which notice of the decision was sent to the student, unless the deadline was extended in response to an extension request as described in 3335-23-18-A(2).
  - Students who accept responsibility through an administrative decision waive their right to appeal, except on the basis that the disciplinary sanction is grossly disproportionate to the violation(s) committed.

- Students are limited to one appeal of a decision, and the decision of the appeal officer is final.
- Information on how to submit an appeal, including grounds for appeal, will be included with communication following a decision from the appropriate hearing body.

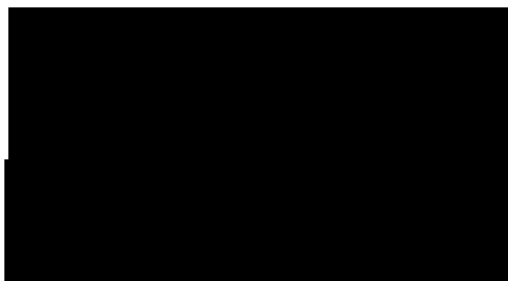


Hello Aaron,
